2012 INTENSIVE WINTER INSTITUTE

THE PURPOSE OF THE 2012 INTENSIVE WINTER INSTITUTE IS TO PROVIDE FELLOWS WITH OPPORTUNITIES TO DISCUSS NEW DISCOVERIES ABOUT ADDICTIONS, MENTAL HEALTH AND ILLNESS, AND HUMAN RESPONSES ACROSS THE LIFESPAN. THE INSTITUTE WILL ALSO EMPHASIZE HOW THESE DISCOVERIES ARE BEING TRANSFORMED INTO PREVENTION AND TREATMENT INTERVENTIONS FOR PEOPLE AND FAMILIES SUFFERING WITH THESE ILLNESSES.

Three objectives will guide the Institute's program:

- Identify the genetic, biological, psychological, and environmental determinants of health on cognitive and emotional development throughout the lifespan.
- Discuss the prudent use and role of brain mapping in addictions and mental health prevention and treatment within the context of culture, ethics, and economic domains.
- Articulate the role of stigma and access to health care in addiction and mental health/illness management for celebrities, icons, the homeless, minority groups, immigrants, and other vulnerable people.
